Field Study by Rachel Seiffert. William Heinemann 2004.

After her stunning 2001 collection The Dark Room, Rachel Seiffert had raised the highest of expectations among her readers for the second collection, Field Study. It is great to be able to report that it not only matches but goes further than its predecessor, fully justifying Granta's 2003 naming of the author as one of the best young British novelists.

There are 11 stories in Field Study, differing in length and geographical setting, but all highly engaging, intriguing and – the ultimate test of a good short story – intensely satisfying.

While it is always invidious and highly subjective to single out one of a collection as being the best, I unhesitatingly nominate Dimitroff, which teases throughout, for this accolade. Other readers will undoubtedly have their own.

I await Rachel Seiffert's next book with eager anticipation.
