Yochanan Muffs, a highly distinguished and renowned Professor at the Jewish Theological Seminary, is perhaps best known for his study of the legal papyri from the $6/5^{th}$ century Jewish colony at Elephantine in Egypt; but I would be surprised if many, having completed The Personhood of God, did not see fit to name it as one of the best and clearest statements of a real and relevant theology as one might wish to read.

The book is divided into five sections: The Biblical God in relationship with a people, The Divine Person, Aesthetic sensibility and religious imagination, Joy, Love, and Liturgy, Encountering the personhood of God.

The Personhood of God can be approached in more than one way; certainly as a work of theology, for scholars or students alike, but perhaps even more important as a source of study and inspiration for those seeking to develop their own relationship with God. There is much to be praised in this text but for special consideration I would single out chapter 2, The Essence of Biblical Process, chapter 6, Biblical Anthropomorphism and chapter 12, Theology and Poetics.

This is a very special book.
