Good poetry never goes out of fashion, and Michael Longley's work is up there with the best of the lyric poets writing today. This collection brings together a huge variety of work dating from 1969 onwards.

This is a veritable cornucopia of fine poems, and it is hard to single out any as being primus inter pares. I must, however, admit to having a particular fondness for Longley's nature poems; The Osprey, Badger, The Bat and Robin being perfect examples. But there is a darker side to Longley's writing too, epitomised by his poem Ghetto and the two liner Terezin, which carries enormous power and pathos.

This is a wonderful anthology of fine work that I recommend to all who love poetry that is easy to read and impossible to forget.
